




Liver-directed Therapies for NETs




Cytoreduction (“Debulking”)

Removes as much of the tumor(s) as possible, leaving the surrounding healthy liver tissue intact




Liver Resection

Removes an entire section of the liver, both cancerous and healthy cells



Interventional Radiology



Bland Embolization


Uses tiny beads or sponges to block the blood flow from the portal vein, starving tumors of nutrients

Radioembolization

The combination of bland embolization with radiation therapy

Chemoembolization (TACE)

Either the combination of bland embolization with chemotherapy, or the direct infusion of chemotherapy into an artery



Microwave Ablation (MWA)

A small probe placed in the tumor destroys cancer cells with electrical current
